## Message of Advisor MRS. P.N. KAVOORI



Disha has completed 25 years of its existence serving the population of children with special needs. It has been a long journey – glimpses of which I am going to share with you.

Way back in 1994, public awareness about disability and the need for rehabilitating children with special needs were practically non-existent. As a developmental educationist, and the then Principal of Maharaja Sawai Man Singh Vidyalaya (MSMSV), I was struggling to solve the problem of providing education to children with learning disabilities. I finally came to the conclusion, that working full time for this cause would be the answer.

A small group of dedicated and aware citizens came with me to initiate this movement by starting a center for Special Education. Our initial goal was to provide a range of rehabilitation services, under one roof, for children and young adults with special needs, where help, with love and understanding would be given to them.

As a consequence of the big demand of admission for children with various disabilities, I had to rethink and had to change my plan to work only with learning disabled. Finally it was decided to start a Multiple disability Center in Jaipur.

Disha centre for Special Education was started on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1995 with an initial strength of 17 children and a bevy of volunteers, in a two bedroom house with a small basement. I took over as Director, Mrs

Deepak Kalra as Principal, Special Educator & Trainer, Mr. Basantt Khaitan was Chairman Executive Board, Dr. Ashok Aggarwal as Trustee and Secretary.

Within two years, strength of the students had more than doubled. Space crunch was coming in the way of effective and innovative work.

A feeling of being empowered pervaded the organization.

We got registered with Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) in year 2000 . We started our first teacher training course -Diploma in Special Education, (CP) in 2002, followed by B Ed in Intellectual Disability (affiliated to University of Rajasthan) in 2008. We are hoping to start B Ed in Learning Disability from the coming session.

To ease the financial burden of running Disha in the year 2001, we had applied for a grant, to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. Although, the grant does not cover all the expenses of running Disha, we are grateful to the Central Government for giving us the same.

To ease the financial burden, EAST a sister concern of Anokhi in the U.K came in as a large financial donor, freeing, to a large extent.

The foundation stone of our existing state of art building was laid in 2002. My heartfelt thanks to RajmataGayatri Devi who connected us to her friend Mrs Elsa Peretti in Italy who gave us funds for this unique building which was completed in record time by July 2004. Our well-equipped Sensory Integration, Aquatic Therapy and Physiotherapy centers were a boon to give relief to our children.

National Trust declared Disha as a State Nodal Agency Centre (SNAC) for the State of Rajasthan for the years 2004-2007.

Times rolled by and Disha made steady progress to become an institute of International repute.

As we go forth to serve this special cause I would like to sign off with an old Irish blessing for all of us.

May the road rise up to meet you.

May the wind always be at your back.

May the sun shine warm upon your face,

And rains fall soft upon your fields.

Let this Silver Year be our motivation to move with double enthusiasm towards the Golden Year.



# Centre for SPECIAL EDUCATION






The Centre for special education at Disha caters to children of a variety of disabilities some of which include cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, and learning difficulties.

At Disha, we have a highly trained team of teachers and professionally qualified therapists that oversee each student with special needs individually. These professionals come with years of hands-on experience in the field which enables them to evaluate the benefits of nurturing individual talent and encourage each student to realize his or her full potential to ensure optimum development of their skills.

The centre for special education was started on 3rd March 1995 with an initial strength of 17 children in a small two-bedroom house. Patience, instilled knowledge with the undying urge to never stop learning helped us grow and achieve our goals of becoming a one of a kind institute in Rajasthan that has

dedicated itself to the rehabilitation of children with disabilities for the last 25 years.

Under CSE, teaching strategies are designed to look at individual student needs. Each student's curriculum is designed looking at an individual's talents, abilities, and preferences. The idea is to transfer as much learning as possible making the curriculum student-centric, unlike the traditional way.

Disha has developed the first of its kind curriculum in Rajasthan for its students with disabilities of 3 to 18 years of age. This curriculum includes core subjects like,

- 1. Languages, Math, Environmental Studies
- 2. Co-curricular subjects like stitching and tailoring, machine work, art and craft leading to the vocational skill development of children to ensure an independent and secure future

- 3. Indoor and outdoor sports activities
- 4. And, skills to promote and enhance their soft skills, life skills and Activities of Daily Living

At Disha, our focus remains on the overall development of all our children by providing them with quality teaching procedures with individualized lesson plans which are adapted to suit our children's differential learning needs. We encourage the use of adaptive equipment and assistive devices to maintain and improve the functioning and independence of our children, to facilitate participation and to enhance overall well-being with the help of accessible teaching-learning material.



Gradually as the years passed, Disha moved to a larger space. With the realization that physical exercises were imperative to the children with special needs, physiotherapy unit was given a more spacious area in the garage portion of the house. Children were very happy as now they had enough space to move around with their mobility aids during their training period.

We still did not have a separate section for speech therapy. The therapist conducted one to one sessions behind the curtains in the corner of one of a classroom or sometimes in the niche of the library. But one, who yearns for, can overcome all the odds. It was delightful to hear children singing, babbling, echoing behind the curtains and communicating through the flash cards within the classrooms.

Step by step, we transmuted from hands-on therapy to basic need equipments like static cycle, parallel bars, crutches, walkers and other mobility aids for our physiotherapy unit which helped our students to achieve faster improvement and functional independence. Butstill there was a lot of scope forfurther expansion of the unit with more advanced gadgets and a separate full-fledged department.

Our deepest gratitude to NandoPerreti Foundation that gave us this beautiful new building and the infrastructure in 2004 which is one of its kind in the state of Rajasthan with 100% accessibility and enough space for all our activities. Today the physiotherapy unit of Disha has grown up into a Centre for Therapies where we provide numerous services to children with special needs according to their necessity.

Knowing the evident effect and benefits of Equine Therapy on special children, Disha wanted no stone

unturned for the amelioration of this sector and hence got associated with 61 Cavalry of Army for making their horses available for Equine Therapy. Our profound gratitude to the ArmyUnit for providing this support to us which made a remarkable impact in the physical and social development of our children.

In 2010, Ms Emily, an Australian volunteer joined us for a few weeks. Incidentally she was an Aquatic therapist by profession. Construction of our Aquatic pool was in

progress with courtesy of Steel Authority of India. Ms Emily got so carried away by the serene and compassionate atmosphere of Disha that she stayed back for almost two years and worked with our children. The customized aquatic pool is the one and only infrastructure in Rajasthan for children with special needs for benefitting their developmental issues.

The State of Art Centre for Therapies of Disha is presently one of its kind in Rajasthan with most advanced technology for therapeutic support to children with special needs.




# PREVOCATIONAL & VOCATIONAL GROUP



The vocational centre was established on the successful completion of 3 years of Disha. For the older students/ young adults, skill enhancement training was found to be essential to help them stand up on their feet and live a life with minimum dependency on others.

Students at Disha are taught one or more skills like stitching, sewing, cooking, fine arts, office helper skills, machine functioning skills depending upon their aptitude and ability under the vocational training program. Students are given on-job training to help them excel at a given task so that they are ready to take on a real job in the outside world.

## CENTRE FOR HOME MANAGEMENT







Home Management is a program for those children or adults who for some reason are not able to take admission in CSE and hence get themselves enrolled in the Home Management program. They visit Disha at regular intervals to get guidance for differently abled children.

During the year of 2019-2020, a total of 96 cases were registered by Centre for Home Management.

When a child with special needs visits Disha for Home Management Program, the first step is to assess the child's intellectual functioning level by the Clinical psychologist. Then, along with special educators, therapists, vocational and sports trainers design the individual need-based home plan for the special child followed by sessions with his/her family to give psycho education according to child's needs and to develop a meaningful and better learning routine for the child.

Counseling sessions are conducted regularly for the differently abled children. Diagnosis and rating of different disorders like ADHD, ASD, learning disorder, anxiety, depression, psychosis are conducted at different intervals. Group therapy sessions are conducted with the families, teachers and children to be able to construct an individualized educational as well as psychological intervention plan for the child.

To ensure that the families of the special children are aware of the training methods, possible facilities and assisting aids, home visits and follow up sessions are carried out on a regular basis. This program also provides services which helps in minimizing the effect of disability on the child and parents. Every assessment is documented to be aware of the child's functioning at every point. This program not only caters to children in Jaipur but also to the outstation children.

## CENTRE FOR HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT



The Human Resource Development (HRD) unit of Disha aims to train young professionals in the field of Special Education by helping them to develop skills and competencies which will enable them to cater to the distinctive needs of children with disabilities.

The HRD unit is responsible for conducting two professional courses:

- B. Ed. in Special Education A two-year course in Mental Retardation (B. Ed. - MR) affiliated to the University of Rajasthan and recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. This program has trained over 350 students since its inception in 2008
- 2. D. Ed. in Special Education A two-year diploma course in Mental Retardation (D. Ed. MR) recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India. This course was launched in 2014 and trains a batch of 30 trainees each year.

In addition to these courses, the HRD unit also conducts training sessions to equip special educators and trainees to handle children with special needs. These sessions are in the form of:

- Continuous Education Program (CEP) This program focuses on training educators and trainees in order to develop skills that would allow them to impart knowledge to children with different types of disabilities
- 4. Continuous Rehabilitation Education (CRE)
   -These training sessions are similar to CEP's but are also available for special educators



from outside of Disha; special educators from different districts of Rajasthan can participate in CRE

Disha believes in building capacities of its stakeholders so that children and adults with disabilities are looked after and benefitted. For this, training sessions for parents of special children, volunteers and interns working with Disha are regularly organized and several awareness programs are also conducted at the community at large.

Continuous efforts and urge to grow has contributed to 12 successful years of functioning of our HRD unit. Disha with a mandate of serving the under-resourced through the means of education has proudly taken a step forward by getting the permission to start one of its kind centre for learning disabilities, under which B.Ed. Special Ed in LD will be offered.

Prachi a very adorable child with Cerebral Palsy is a student of Disha for last 3 years. Being Cerebral Palsy is like an intelligent brain in a disobedient body. She understands everything about her physical limitations and hence is very sensitive about her disability.

She had shown a high desire to stand, walk and be more upright. Keeping this in mind it was decided to take her for the gait training on treadmill with the support of the unweighing support system, a system which helps in unloading the child's weight while she is attempting to walk on the treadmill..

Today, she is made to walk on the treadmill which initiated her walking abilities, which she is liking a lot and hence participating in the physiotherapy sessions with an ever increasing dedication and discipline. We hope that achievements in this task will make her feel good and we all would see her being able to stand, walk and be more upright and be self sufficient.

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## RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT



In the third year (2019-20) of the Research and Development Unit at Disha, the work was done on theme-wise consolidation of the research work done in the the first two years and creating a research resource for referencing the future. Two volumes were produced by the researcher Dr Alka Awasthi under the guidance of Senior Research Fellow Dr Lalit Kishore, namely, (a) Citations with references; and (b) Analogy of research abstracts of the intervention designs and special education toolkit of gestures. However, Dr. Awasthi left the institution in the last quarter of 2019 owing to family obligations.

The project entered the critical phase of applied research towards individualized education programme and diagnostic lesson studies to create curricular material and literature for children with special needs for transition of research to individualized learning. For this work, the part-time valuable assistance was provided by Mrs. Vibhanshu Gaur and Ms. Neha Saini.

The lesson studies done with dysgraphic children in science instruction were compiled as a research report that received the Commonwealth Award for which Dr. Kishore was felicitated by the school management. The report is available in the school library as research document was displayed during the EC Meeting along with curricular material developed by the R&D Unit.

On the basis of the evaluation studies of the Mother and Child Training Programme, the structure of sessions and activities of the training were reorganized with the assistance of Mrs. Vibhanshu Gaur resulting in its enhanced

effectiveness.

The year under review was marked by evidence based activities with the early intervention group resulting into a set of fine-motor coordination activities and attentiveness training through a source book with 100 odd activity sheets prepared at the unit with try-outs by Mrs. Vibhanshu Gaur.

The research in the area of proxemics and ergonomics was also initiated that resulted in the design of learning station, wedge-shaped cushions, slant reading board, game-boards, card games, stick puppets, language big books, children's mini-books, cut-paste craft book were produced and clinical trials done for their standardization in which the assistance came forth from

Four action research papers were produced by the special educators for presentation during the National Conference organized by Disha and the research abstracts received by the delegated were edited the research unit.

The search project transformed the work culture and school functionaries became reflective on their work to improve their practice for the benefit of children. Triangulated focus groups were formed with Assistant Coordinator as a group member for individualization as well as for adapting and creating intervention based on the diagnosis of children. The instructional approach was crystallized and called 'Diagnostic-Prognostic Micro-Learning Based Continuous Progress Approach' and was owned up the special educators and management since was a homegrown approach.


